
NEW BEGINNINGS



WORD OF THE WEEK

Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22

At that time: As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, 'I baptise you with waters, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire.'

Now when all the people were baptised by John the Baptist and when Jesus also had been baptised and was praying, the heavens were opened, and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a vice cam from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.'

"You are my Beloved: with you I am well pleased."

This is a beautiful quote from this week's Gospel. God not only addresses Jesus as his beloved son but us too as his beloved children. Through our faith and baptism we are united with Jesus and share in His identity as beloved children of God. Take a moment to think about what this quote means to you.
