This wasn't just another school trip; it was a spark ignited by the National Cyber Security Centre's (NCSC) CyberFirst initiative, designed to empower the next generation of female tech leaders. Delivered by IN4 Group, the event transported the girls into a world of cutting-edge innovations across areas including Cyber Security, Robotics, AI, OSINT (Open Source Intelligence), Immersive Tech, Data Analytics, Esports, and Problem Solving. They connected with inspiring women who are shaping the future of STEM, explored the power and potential of these diverse fields, and discovered the thrill of tackling real-world challenges. More than just learning about technology, the girls experienced it first-hand, igniting a passion that could lead them to become the cybersecurity experts, AI innovators, data scientists, and tech pioneers of tomorrow.

Congratulations to Imogen in Year 9 on her outstanding achievement! Since joining Preston Harriers in the summer of last year, she has truly excelled in her athletic pursuits. Competing in a variety of 200m and 300m events across the North West, Imogen has shown tremendous determination and talent. Her commitment to training and perseverance through each competition have clearly set her apart from her peers.

Recently, Imagen took on a new challenge by entering the 200m race at the prestigious Northern competitions in Sheffield. This event brought together some of the best young athletes in the region, and Imagen rose to the occasion, showcasing her skills and competitive spirit.

At the Northern competitions in Sheffield, her efforts culminated in an impressive performance. Not only did she compete fiercely, but she also achieved a remarkable personal best time of 25.68 seconds in the 200m event, earning a Gold Medal as a testament to her hard work and dedication. Imogen also faced the challenge of competing against athletes who were a year older than her in the English Championships last weekend. Despite this formidable competition, she achieved yet another notable success—she is now the UI5 300m English champion, winning gold with a new personal best of 40.24 seconds.

This innovative platform will allow us to communicate with you more effectively about your child's attendance. Through 'Attend', you will receive regular updates regarding any attendance concerns or achievements, ensuring that you are always informed and engaged in your child's school journey.

We sincerely encourage your support in helping us instill resilience and determination in your child. It's vital for their academic and personal growth that they attend school consistently and feel secure in their learning environment. By working together, we can ensure that our students not only succeed academically but also enjoy their schooling experience to the fullest.

EXCESSIVE LEAVE IN TERM TIME - S444 EDUCATION ACT 1996

Lancashire County Council are currently reviewing the arrangements for pupils who are absent from school due to unauthorised leave/holidays.

Attendance at school is vital to help children thrive and achieve their best. Children who are absent from school can fail to meet their academic potential and those who fall below 90% attendance are at significant risk of underachieving.

Absence during term time must be avoided. If you are considering taking your child out of school for any reason, it is essential that you request permission for the absence.

When penalty notices are issued, parents have the opportunity to discharge liability for an offence under S444 of the Education Act instead of being prosecuted by the Local Authority. The penalty notice regulations determine the amount of the penalty notice fine. Unfortunately, some parents are choosing to remove their children from school for longer periods, as the fine amount is the same regardless of the number of school days missed.

From 01/01/2025, the following rules will apply:

- 1. Unauthorised leave less than 15 school days: penalty notice issued
- 2. **Unauthorised leave of 15 school days or more:** the Local Authority will review any requests for penalty notices and may **prosecute** parents and not offer the opportunity to pay a penalty notice fine instead.

Where enough notice is given for a warning to be issued, and a request made is for 3 weeks (15 school days) or more out of school, the Local Authority may issue you with a warning explaining that you will not have the opportunity to pay a fine and that you will be prosecuted if the leave is still taken. Even if the authority doesn't send you a warning letter, you can still be prosecuted for the offence as there is no legal entitlement to a warning or a penalty notice.

Failure to ensure your child's regular attendance at school is a criminal offence, and this means that if you are convicted, this could result in a fine of up to £2,500 and you will have a criminal record.


We have been asked by Lancashire County Council to issue this warning to parents to inform you that this procedure will now be applied to all excessive leave requests made to this school.

Luke 6: 27-38

Give to everyone who asks you for something, and when someone takes what is yours, do not ask for it back. Do for others just what you want them to do for you.

And if you do good only to those who do good to you, why should you receive a blessing? Even sinners do that! And if you lend only to those from whom you hope to get it back, why should you receive a blessing? Even sinners lend to sinners, to get back the same amount! No! Love your enemies and do good to them; lend and expect nothing back. You will then have a great reward, and you will be children of the Most High God. For he is good to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful just as your Father is merciful.
