
Jubilee Year 2025: Pilgrims of Hope



Giant Scarf Project with Preston North End Community and Education Trust

You may have already heard about the PNE Giant scarf scheme, a collaboration between the National Football Museum and Preston North End Community. Inspired by a historic hand knitted fan scarf from the 1960s, participants are invited to knit a strip (or strips) to form a giant PNE-coloured scarf which will go on display at a special celebration in Spring 2025. As part of the scheme, PNE are also collecting full size scarves in any colour for the Foxton Centre in Preston, so it is possible to get involved in a variety of ways.

We have been working with PNE to develop the pattern for this and we are now inviting our pupils and families to contribute to the scheme by knitting (or crocheting!) strips of the scarf in blue, navy or white wool. I have limited amounts of yarn from PNE which pupils can use in school. Knitting club takes place every Thursday at 12:50 in room 19 for any aspiring crafters!







VEX Robotics Challenge

Due to the increasing number of forgotten items being brought into school, our office staff are finding it challenging to deliver them to students during the day. Unfortunately, the volume of items has reached an unmanageable level, making it difficult for the staff to efficiently carry out their duties. We have now introduced a convenient solution to help reduce disruptions and make it easier for students to receive their forgotten items. A designated 'Forgotten Items Box' has been placed outside the main school entrance, where parents can deposit items such as PE kits, books, and other essential items. To ensure a smooth and efficient process, our office staff will check the box at the following times: 8:55 am, break time, lunchtime, and 3:05 pm. They will then deliver the labelled items to the respective students, helping to minimize classroom disruptions and allowing students to focus on their

We believe this new system will greatly benefit both students and staff, and we appreciate your cooperation in using the Forgotten Items Box.




Peace Sunday 2025

essed Franz Jägerstätter

Blessed Franz Jägerstätter was an Austrian farmer who courageously refused to fight for Nazi Germany during World War II, even though it meant facing imprisonment and death. He believed that following God's command to love and respect all people meant standing up against evil, no matter the cost. Franz's decision was a powerful act of peace, showing that true peace comes from standing up for what is right, even when it is difficult. This Peace Sunday, we can look to his example of bravery, faith, and commitment to peace in our own lives, by choosing to live with integrity and stand up for justice.
